## Hotel Registration

# Message from Treasurer Betty Baxter

Those of you interested in qualifying for the 2026 Five Star Woman award should begin now to meet the qualifications of giving in all the five areas of mission giving. The qualifying year runs from July 1 to June 30, but please don't wait until the last day to submit your form. This deadline is earlier than the other reports. Custom pins must be ordered by the Conference treasurer. It can take up to 8 weeks to get the pins. For more information or to get a Five Star Woman form, please contact your local treasurer.

Did you know that the United Women in Faith has gift to mission cards for various occasions - birthdays, congratulations, special day, etc. When purchasing these cards, not only do you get a card to send, you also give to mission. Gift in memory cards are also available, and again you are giving to mission. Please note that mission cards are available through your district treasurer. Turn your card order form, found at <https://uwfaithresources.org/prodDetail.cfm?productID=12391&catid=2199>, to your local treasurer who will send it on to the district treasurer. The district treasurer may need to order the cards from UWFaith resources.

Spread the word about the Osment-Neil Scholarship. The Arkansas Conference United Women in Faith provides scholarships each year to women furthering their education in religious studies. These scholarships are made possible through the Osment-Neil Endowment Fund which was established in 1972 to support young women attending Scarritt College for Christian Workers. After the college closed, its facilities became the Scarritt Bennett Center. At that point, the scholarship funds were made available to women studying in the religious field at any school

## Osment-Neil Scholarship Qualifications

1. Active membership in the United Methodist Church
2. Preparing for church-related vocation, such as Minister, Deacon, Deaconess, Missionary, Christian Educator or Church and Community Developer
3. Proof of enrollment in an accredited college or seminary
4. Evidence of financial need
5. An ability to maintain average grade point
6. Deadline for submission of application - October 1

Scholarship funds will be distributed in early November.

### **Jesus Meets Us with Beauty**

In a time when climate change disrupts lives and landscapes, especially in vulnerable communities, Jesus still meets us with beauty. Women, often first to bear the weight of environmental crises, are also on the frontlines of healing and hope. From planting community gardens to advocating for clean water and sustainable policies, women of faith are protecting God's creation for generations to come.

Throughout Scripture, Jesus often drew lessons from nature: the lilies of the field, the birds of the air, the mustard seed. These signs of beauty were not just decoration; they were living testimonies of God's care and provision. In every flower, sunrise, and breath of fresh air, we encounter Christ's reminder that creation is both fragile and sacred.

Here we find the concept of Refugia. In ecology, refugia are small, sheltered places where life survives during times of devastation—tiny sanctuaries that preserve seeds of renewal. Spiritually, refugia reminds us that even in seasons of crisis, God provides places of restoration and growth. Women of faith are creating such refugia—community gardens, prayer circles, education initiatives—where justice, resilience, and beauty are nurtured.

This is what I learned at Mission u. The lessons of climate justice and faith opened my eyes to the power of creating refugia in our communities. So I encourage each United Woman in Faith to plan to attend in 2027. Together, we will learn, grow, and act as Christ's hands and heart in a world that desperately needs both hope and beauty.

Jesus meets us in these refugia, where brokenness becomes fertile ground for new life. As we protect the earth, we participate in God's work of restoration, ensuring that future generations can see His beauty in creation.

# Membership, Nurture & Outreach

The results of the survey are in! In Arkansas 70.51% of units reported growth in new members!

National has started new member campaign for 2024-28. This campaign has a reigniting purpose, restoring connection and extending a life-giving invitation to women who are searching for something deeper. We can reach this goal by one woman telling another, one invitation at a time, 1 soul stirred at a time and 1 woman at a time becoming unstoppable. In Arkansas the survey shows that 34% of units have already committed to growth from 2024-28, 24% have committed to increasing attendance, and 21% to increasing giving. Is your unit ready to make this commitment? The goal for the 4 years is 200,000 new members nationally. We can accomplish this goal using this formula:

- Large Units (51+ members) adding 5 new members
- Mid-Size Units (11-50 members) adding 3-4 new members
- Small Units (10 or fewer members) adding 2 new members

The goal for 2025-26 is 30,000 new members nationwide. I believe Arkansas can do their part! Year One of a Bold New Era! This year is about sharing your "why"—your faith, purpose, and voice. Let your testimony create connections and inspire others to take action. Be bold: Write down three things that inspire you about UWFaith, post them online, and tag #UnstoppableUWFaith to spread the movement.


